Dear Friends,

Spring is in the air, but many of our friends in need are still struggling with a lack of clothing, food, shelter, transportation, and access to services. This is why we keep growing and changing at SVdP, to meet people's needs in new, effective ways.

Here are some of the opportunities and challenges we're working on at SVdP:

## **The Southside location is open!**

After a ton of hard work, resourcefulness, grant writing, set-up, prayer, and collaboration, St. Vincent de Paul held a grand opening for its new south side campus on Jan. 21. Customers were lined up and chanting as the store opened, pouring in to examine the new store. The south side SVDP did more than \$4,800 in sales that day!

The new store is intended to continue SVdP's mission of assisting those living in poverty to become self-sufficient by removing barriers to success. In addition to the thrift store, the campus includes a Social Services Department with food, clothing and furniture pantries, as well as providing car seats and cribs to new parents. Social Services also has computers available to help people with job searches and continued education.

The new campus is located in the largest food desert in Polk County. Food deserts are areas where fresh fruit, vegetables and other healthy foods are not readily available. Because of this, SVDP received funds from Hunger Free Polk County to ensure we could help fulfill nutritional needs in the area.

The store portion of the campus is what central Iowa SVDP stores will be modeled after moving forward. It's large, more than 12,000 square feet, with an open feel and large windows that give customers a look inside. The polished concrete floors have a mirror-like quality, creating a feel unlike any other thrift store in the area.

The store has a focus on vintage items, with an area set aside for cool and quirky furniture, art, signs, collectibles and more. St. Vincent de Paul will always have a focus on serving the needs of the community, but the vintage focus will also help us pull in new customers and fund our charity work.

The new St. Vincent de Paul Service Center is located at 520 Army Post Road, and we'd love to have you volunteer, shop, or donate with us!

## **Healthy Relationships at Home and Work (expansion):**

We are excited to share that SVdP's partnership with the Iowa Center for Faith-Based Activities and Healthy Relationships Iowa is stronger than ever! Starting this Spring, SVdP will not only be working with the men in the Bridges program in the Polk County Jail, but is also working with the women in the Bridges program in Adair. This partnership will help develop even stronger outcomes for these individuals that need support so badly.

### Enhancing the Level of Dignity for Our Friends

St. Vincent de Paul wishes to extend its sincere gratitude to Mark Hummel, Hummel Nissan, for his generous work with Janice Kellogg, a student working in the St. Vincent de Paul HiSET Preparation classes.

Janice had been attending classes on a regular basis since early 2016 when she encountered some car problems. Janice was informed that her car needed its rotors replaced, a process that would cost upwards of \$700, including labor costs.

Given her car was her primary means of transportation, this meant Janice could no longer attend classes unless assisted with cab fare or a ride from a fellow student.

Steve Havemann, Executive Director of St. Vincent de Paul Council, contacted Mark Hummel to see whether he could provide a quote with reduced labor costs. When Mark Hummel learned of Janice's car situation he offered to replace the damaged rotors with new parts at no charge.

"I just wanted to let you know how much I appreciate you and your staff for fixing my car," said Janice. "My car is running wonderful. This means I can get to class and go look for a job. If I get a job, I know I can get to work. Thank you again so much!" Both Janice and the staff at St. Vincent de Paul are still reeling from the extent of Mark Hummel's generosity, and would like to publicly thank him for assisting a dedicated student of the Education Center.

### **REFLECTIONS – From the Desk of Fr. John Bertogli**

Our Lives are a combination of contradictions. We hope for change, but fear conversation. We seek repentance, but are unsure of mercy. We look for new life, then resist it when it comes.

Lent is a call to renew our commitment that has grown dull, maybe a life marked by routine rather than reflection. We are challenged to decide whether we truly believe that Jesus is the Christ, and if we believe whether we will live accordingly even when we don't hear the angels singing in our lives or when the star of Bethlehem has grown dim in us. Lent enables us to face ourselves, to see the weak places, to touch the wounds in our souls and to try once more to live beyond our lowest aspirations and dreams.

This holy season reminds us that life is short and change is urgent. It reminds us of what we have become and prods us to do better. It is about opening our hearts and turning away our savings of excess, our fleeting self gratifications and childlike addiction for attention and pleasure. The voice of Lent is the promise of forgiveness. It keeps our souls melded to the spirit within us. These 40 days teach us that darkness may try to overtake us, but will not overcome good as long as we refuse to become the very thing we hate. Lent is our salvation from the depth of nothingness. It is our hope to the more and best of life.

Our hope as Vincentians is to serve the marginal and unnoticed, and find the face of Christ in their vulnerability. To take a second good look and see the image of Jesus can only be achieved by prayer, one of the foundations of Lent. May the words of our patron saint, Vincent de Paul, be ours these 40 DAYS and forever. "If God is at the center of your life, no words are necessary. Your mere presence will touch hearts."
