I have lived for the past eleven years at Mercy Park Apartments on the Mercy Medical Center campus. It was close to the Cathedral to get back and forth for my ministry of Rector at St. Ambrose, not to mention very convenient for all hours if needed at the hospital. August, 2016, the hospital closed the apartment units due to the need to expand patient rooms and parking space.

The past two weeks have found me in transition to a new living location. Packing for a new move interrupts our comfort zones, demands, time, energy and patience. In route of my many trips back and forth from my apartment to the new unit, I witnessed many hitch-hikers and homeless people on the streets. My frustrations seemed very small weighted to their concerns. Jesus tells us, "The poor you will always have with you." Our Lord's point is that we cannot ignore them or their needs when we have an opportunity to reveal His face in such vulnerable settings.

I continue to be grateful to the St. Vincent De Paul parish conferences, our administrators and staff, those who serve in the 6th Avenue offices and those in the field working directly with those who come to us looking for the image of Jesus. St. Vincent de Paul said, "If God is the center of your life, no words are necessary. Your mere presence will touch hearts."
