The Des Moines Society of St. Vincent de Paul is off to a banner start in 2016, because of the hard work, dedication, caring, and perseverance of the team at SVdP (Staff and Volunteers alike).

In the last Newsletter we covered our partnership with Bridges of Iowa and St. Gregory Retreat Centers for the Healthy Relationships Iowa Grant and our current partnership with The Polk County Board of Supervisors.

We are excited to announce several new partnerships and organizational funding streams that are helping our organization grow to even better serve our friends in need.

United Way of Central Iowa:

As a result of the dedication to "Ending Poverty Through Systemic Change," and some true innovation, St. Vincent de Paul is excited to share that we are now a United Way Agency. United Way, who will be funding the HSED (High School Equivalency Degree) preparation class in our Education Center, as well as some Financial Literacy work, is excited to work with SVdP again. Each student preparing for his/her high school completion will be strategically paired with a mentor, attend class at no charge, benefit from a small-group learning environment, and have access to our Child-Watch Center, Food Pantry, and a free, healthy meal each night they attend class. Through this process we are not only helping our friends meet their basic needs, but helping them think, act, and behave more positively and productively.

Partnership with Hunger-Free Polk County: In the last newsletter we mentioned that the Polk

County Board of Supervisors began raising awareness and dollars around the increasing need for food and food pantries in Polk County. As the dollars were raised, several key contractors were identified in the greater Des Moines area. Through the grace of God, as well as several presentations and proposals, St. Vincent de Paul has been chosen as one of these key partners.

SVdP has already expanded Food Pantry hours to: 8:30AM-3:30PM Monday, Wednesday, and Friday, 8:30AM-7:00PM Tuesday and Thursday, and 10:30AM-2:00PM on Saturdays. We will also be installing refrigeration to provide produce and other healthy foods to our friends, as well as remodeling the pantry to increase accessibility and efficiency.

Expansion of Services AND Location:

Additionally, The Board of Supervisors and SVdP had conversation about the need for food, clothing, and personal needs pantries on the Southside of Des Moines. Through these conversations, the opportunity to expand our operations became a reality. We are excited to share that we will be opening a second Vintage and Thrift Store, Food, Clothes, Personal Needs, and Infant/Childcare Pantries and assistance in the fall of 2016!! We are also considering partnerships with other, likeminded organizations to create a St. Vincent de Paul Service Center at 500 and 520 Army Post Road.

Volunteers will be needed more than ever, so please share with your friends the exciting news of SVdP expansion! We will have more information coming soon!

SHOWING OUR SUCCESS— Why our Work Matters

My name is Rebecca Fetters, and I would like to share with you all the impact the work SVdP has on the community, and those who volunteer there. Until I attended Mercy College (and enrolled in the Servant Leadership course), I had not done any volunteer work in a while. Through my time volunteering at SVdP, I feel like this opened the door for me to starting giving back again.

I went into this experience thinking I was there to assist with the needs of the community, not expecting to get anything in return from this experience, but I was pleasantly surprised. I guess I have always thought it was those who were more fortunate responsibility to give to those less fortunate. I learned this is not the case, in fact everyone should serve everybody with a servant's heart no matter the financial status.

I came from a unique background as my parents were financially stable but I had a mental health illness which lead me to places that were not so good. People judged me daily and I can still feel the pain that this brought to my life.

The best part of this experience were the lessons of love and caring that I witnessed. This was great because it made me realize that I was to strive to be a better person and serve with a more loving heart. I witnessed real struggle and sacrifice, and emotional and financial poverty.

While I know this experience will not be a sincere service opportunity for everyone it was for me. It reminded me of a part of me that I had lost. I had been lost for the last several months struggling with where I wanted to be versus where I was. I needed a wake up and an experience that would help me find my way.

I believe that God knows when we are struggling and if we love and serve him, he will always help us find our way back. I also believe that I might not always understand his plan, I just have to be patient and let him lead. I know that this was my Savior's way of helping me find my way back

Last week in the midst of a hectic, busy and frustrating morning, a refugee from our parish insisted he visit with me. He had settled in the metro with a job and apartment with the hope to bring his family here from Africa. He returned to his native homeland to secure them only to find out, due to the political struggle and violent civil war, his wife and family could not accompany him back to lowa. He was able to return here and wanted to secure his previous job as a maintenance worker. The income from his labors he would send back to his family for their livelihood. To get the above data and history from him was time consuming due to language barriers and limited communication skills.

Patience and time were the gifts needed to be of service to the man in need. The St. Vincent de Paul mission is rooted in service. apostolate is more than government agencies who avail themselves to those with immediate forms of outreach. Our baptismal call is rooted in the paschal mystery to enter into the dying and rising of the lives of those we encounter. That dignity stretches our vision so we can get a glimpse of the face of Jesus in those living the crucified life. Our empathy, compassion and mercy can bring the resurrected life to hopefilled fruition to the desperate and marginal. That awareness and growth keeps our spirit of Vincentian Mission alive and well. private and public, is vital for that to happen. It is God's work we engage in, not our own. Prayer helps us to focus on that truth. In gratitude for all the Lord has done for us, and that litany is long, may we continue to find the face of Christ in all we meet and attempt to serve.
